



Cork Harbour Festival is running from Saturday Next for a week and includes the Ocean to City Race on Saturday and the Cork City Marathon on Monday. We will muster on **Friday** evening and a 10:30 on Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

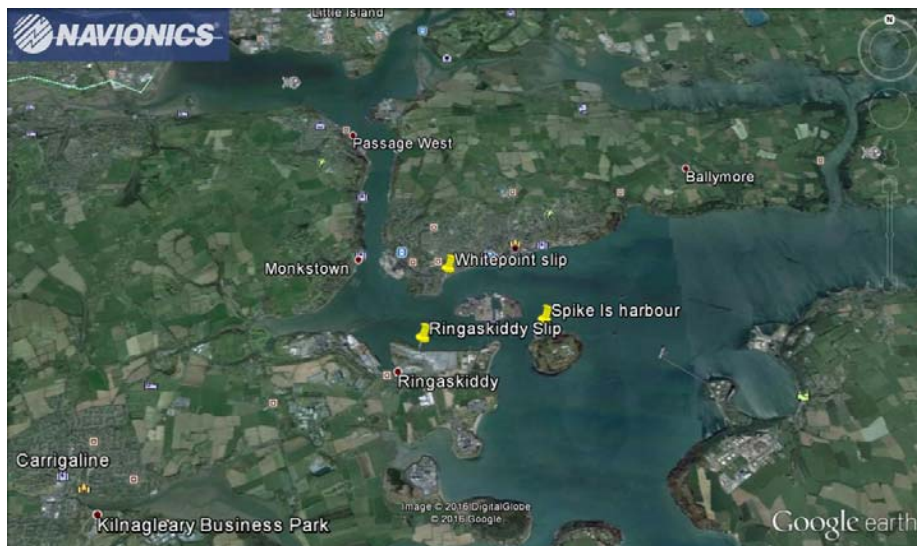

On Sunday, Spike Island has an open day event so we plan to avail of that, followed by a visit to Passage for the local community festivities there. We have the option to take the flood up towards Cork or Fota as suits us.

On Monday, the high tide is at 19:30 so we can escape to sea on the ebb bound for White Bay, Ringabella or Gayleen as we judge based on the weather and our remaining enthusiasm.

The event is for sail, oar, outboard, or any combination of means of propulsion preferred.

This is an open, peer event - no fees, no liability. Anybody is welcome to join for all or part of the weekend.
